## **SERMON**

#### Dear Friends,

Years ago, I found myself with a sense of call to ministry— one that kept growing with the passage of time. The problem, in my mind, was that I was no spring chicken! The years had caused more than a token amount of gray hair to grow on top of my noggin.

Ever notice how our lives are often marked by a sequence of seasons? Upon reflection, I can see how each additional season builds upon those which preceded it — each contributing useful lessons from the past that will be helpful in the future .

Well, it is time now for our family to enter into another season! Some may say it is time for me to be put out to pasture. Certainly, signs are all around me that say it is a time in my life to move on to a new season. The most recent indicator for change is my diagnosis of having Parkinson's disease.

Yes, it is time for change .

Even though I am an Anglican, I must admit it is time for change. I am not sure what that change may look like. Often, previous changes of seasons are accompanied with memorable inconveniences. Often too, are heard voices of encouragement; and, yes, sometimes, discouragement.

Overall, life has been richer for these experiences. In addition to church work, a partial list includes: Sally and I meeting at an exchange dinner; work in a tool and die shop; studies at Michigan State University and at Huron College; municipal work in Detroit, Sarnia and London; and also a move to Canada from the U.S. Along the way, we were blessed with the gift of five children!

Our planet Earth also continues to go through various seasons, as it has since the beginning of Creation. These seasons are of greater impact, greater change. We learn about many of these through archaeological explorations and more. God's hand can be seen in God's handiworks.

Even now, we have a sense of our going through another very complex season. Recent history has seen society embrace newly developed technologies which have allowed us to work on human problems as never before. Yet, we are beginning to find that new technologies do not always lead us to happier lives. Some of us are old enough to remember living lives that seemed more fulfilling with simpler technologies. Some advances can also lead us to a list of greater dangers— dangers that are life threatening on a massive scale (e.g. Nuclear weapons.(

A new category of danger to add to our contemporary season is "AI," Artificial Intelligence! These advances see the acceleration of product and systems development by including the ability to "learn "and to think —— "to learn and to think better, by some standards, than the humans who create them!

Again, research and development results can run from being really wonderful; to absolutely devastating. The fear is that Al technologies have no built-in consciences and could decide to provide its priorities on attaining its own ends, while endangering humanity.

Clearly, humanity needs to have the spiritual insights that only God can provide. The church has an important role to play as society moves along making history. May we contribute to the building of a more compassionate and loving society for all people.

I am now going to turn our attention to what I see as one of the most important Bible passages :Matthew 22:3 .40-7Here, we come to learn that Jesus wants us to know the importance of God's gift of love.

It is here that he shares God's wisdom with us when he says:

' "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart , and with all your soul ,and with all your mind '.

This is the greatest and first commandment.

And a second is like it'You shall love your neighbour as yourself'. On these two command ments hang all the law and the prophets".

In their ministry, clergy and others see a full range of joy and also a full range of pain and despair. We see how needless it is for so many folk to be recipients of inflicted pain. Much of what people experience is tied to the degree of how much love comes into any situation . Whether they are related to personal occasions; families; businesses; corporations; government agencies; or whatever else — good decisions and good actions are often best made when they are lovingly made!

Oh, did I mention churches in this regard? Canon Davis Memorial Church is a good example, in my mind! I often tell people who are looking for a church to ask themselves whether it has a feeling of being a home — a place of love.

I have had the blessing of serving in churches in which most members got along really well. Canon Davis is among these. It is a wonderful place with people who love God and show this in all aspects of parish life. Whenever a call for help is made, or a need becomes known; people respond to see how they can be of help! One reflection of this is found in their emphasis as a parish community on hospitality!

Our season at CDMC was very positive because of the love of the people, here. We have had outstanding internal and external community support to help us in our ministry. We are so thankful for our family to have shared in the life of Canon Davis Memorial Church over the past decade. May the work of Christ continue here in love. May the love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit be known by all who come in through our doors.

The blessing of God Almighty, the Son Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit be with the people of Canon Davis Memorial Church and with all they reach out to serve.

We now pray in the words of Brother Roger of Taizé:

"God of Mercy, when we understand nothing can separate us from you, trust in you opens for us the road that leads upward towards a peace-filled joy".

Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this church has received them, and will you, in accordance with the canons of this diocese, obey all Priests who may have authority over you and your work?

#### CANDIDATE:

I am willing and ready so to do.

## PRIEST:

May God guide and bless you in the doing of this.

THE WARDENS read the Bishop's license.

THE PRIEST takes the candidate by the right hand.

## PRIEST:

*Virginia Ann Schleihauf*, I admit you to the Office of Lay Reader of this Parish; and I give you this *Bible* as a token of your ministry; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
