Gospel

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea - for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

Sermon

John the Baptist is gone, finally! We've been hearing about this guy since the beginning of Advent over 6 weeks ago, John, John, John. Give me some Jesus! No more locusts and hair shirts, just Jesus gentle and mild. Well, sort of.

John's message of repentance isn't going anywhere. He called us down to the riverside to be cleansed and to encourage us to refocus our lives off of whatever we were doing before and on to Jesus. Repentance means just that, to turn around—Metanoia, to change, 180 degrees. Your life before this wasn't necessarily bad or even wrong, just not going where it needs to go, according to Jesus. Jesus doesn't let go of John's call of repentance but adds to it, the call to believe. What John was getting us ready for, has come in Jesus, so what will we do now that the kingdom of God has come near?

Well, let's see what Jesus has in mind. As he calls the first of his disciples. Simon (Peter) and Andrew are fishing, and then all of a sudden they are not, they are disciples soon to be apostles. It happens that fast, they don't seem to have that much to lose. Then Jesus calls James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who seem to be in charge of a fishing business of some sort, they have a bit more to give up, I mean did anyone ever ask poor Zebedee how he feels about Jesus taking his sons away from him. But again, they are mending nets in one moment, and then in the next, they are fishing for men.

That's where today's tale ends. It's a stark choice to follow Jesus! There can be serious consequences to following the Messiah of God. Lots of us have these sorts of tales as well. Loss and suffering on par with what Jesus experienced. It's not as if he wasn't willing to make a sacrifice or two to make his mission happen. He was all in. Not only did he receive John's baptism, but he picked up where he left off, and added his bold vision. It was not enough to repent, we must believe.

So what do you believe? Do you know? It might be useful for us as a congregation to have some sense of what we believe as we get ready for another vestry meeting in a few weeks. I did a seminar as I was finishing up my seminary training over a decade ago. We were asked to write a three-page paper on everything we had learned during our degree and how it had changed our beliefs. With 30 courses worth of info to synthesize it was probably the worst paper I had ever written in grad school. We were made to read them out loud in front of our classmates, but it was fascinating to hear what others thought was important. Then we were asked to come back in a month with our three-page paper edited down to 1 page. Same thing. So hard. Then after a month, we were asked to come back and give a 30-second elevator speech. And then finally for the 4th class to come back with less than 7 words.

Here are mine: "Whatever the question, Love is the answer." That is what I believe. That is what I will take to the pearly gates, and more importantly, to the altar today when I meet God once again. So not that you have to have an answer before you go up for communion, but now you have some homework for the next few weeks before vestry.

What do you believe? Jesus wants to know. If you want some help figuring it out, then let me know.

A lesson in history: "The first Diocesan Women's Auxiliary annual meeting was held in the Diocese of Ontario at St. George's Cathedral on June 8, 1887. The group was imbued with missionary zeal. Even in those early years the Women's Auxiliary had a wide vision and boundless interest in missionary work, both in Canada and around the world. In 1966, the Women's Auxiliary was amalgamated with the other Women's Ministries and became known as the Anglican Church Women (ACW)." When I was asked to take on the role of President of the ACW Ladies Guild, to my knowledge this was how our group was to be identified. I recently learned that we are the only church in the Diocese that refers to ourselves as the ACW Ladies Guild. In order to be in compliance with the ACW purpose, we will now identify as the ACW, which is for all Anglican Church Women who attend Canon Davis Memorial Church. Carol Mercurio
