The Collect of the Day

First ReadingExodus 12: 1-14 A READING FROM THE BOOK OF EXODUS

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbour in obtaining one: the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight. They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgements: I am the Lord. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance. Officiant: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

Psalm149 (*Response in bold.*)

Hallelujah! Sing to the Lord a new song; sing his praise in the congregation of the faithful.

Second ReadingRomans 13: 8-14

A READING FROM THE LETTER OF PAUL TO THE ROMANS

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You

shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbour as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law. Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

The GospelMatthew 18: 15-20

THE HOLY GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus said, "If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

Sermon

Sermon Matthew 18: 15-20 September 10th, 2023 In today's Gospel, Jesus is speaking about resolving conflicts within the Christian community....reconciliation and resolution. How often have we heard those words? Jesus is emphasizing the importance of addressing conflicts with love and seeking reconciliation within the Christian community, as well as the power of unified prayer and the presence of God

when believers come together in His name. Jesus offers his disciples spiritual freedom and power for restoring broken or injured relationships. He says, don't brood over an offense – but speak directly and privately. If we truly want to settle a difference with someone, we need to do it face to face.

"The Gruffalo" by Julia Donaldson is a story about a clever little mouse who encounters various predators (a fox, an owl, and a snake) while walking through the woods. To avoid being eaten, the mouse invents a fictional creature called the Gruffalo and describes it as a creature even scarier than the predators. The mouse's clever storytelling skills and confidence help it escape each

dangerous encounter. However, the mouse is in for a surprise when it actually meets a real Gruffalo in the woods. Through quick thinking, the mouse manages to convince the Gruffalo that it is the scariest creature in the forest.

This story is not only entertaining but also provides valuable lessons about resolving conflicts and finding peaceful solutions through cleverness and negotiation. It shows that conflicts can be resolved through intelligence and resourcefulness rather than confrontation

In Matthew 18:15-20, Jesus provides guidance on handling conflicts and addressing sin within the community of believers. While it may appear harsh, the intention is to promote reconciliation and accountability within the church. The process outlined encourages individuals to address wrongdoing privately, involving more people only if necessary to resolve the issue.

The ultimate goal is to restore the person who has sinned and reconcile them with the community. It emphasizes forgiveness and reconciliation rather than punishment. However, the severity of the situation may require different levels of intervention, and the involvement of the whole church is seen as a last resort.

Involving other members of the church in the process of addressing sin is not intended to create more conflict but rather to promote accountability, reconciliation, and healing within the community. The process outlined in Matthew 18:15-20 is a structured way to deal with conflicts and wrongdoing in a manner that seeks to restore relationship; and is meant to provide support, guidance, and a sense of community during difficult times. It also serves as a way to ensure fairness and prevent any one person from having undue influence or bias in resolving the issue.

While the process may seem challenging, its ultimate goal is to mend broken relationships and bring about repentance and reconciliation. It's important to approach these situations with caring, humility, and a desire for restoration, following the principles of forgiveness and grace that Jesus taught throughout his ministry.

Holy Spirit, renew our hearts and lead us on the path of true repentance and reconciliation. Today we pray O Lord our God, to be reconciled to you by the power of the Holy Spirit. Make us a new creation and help us live in Christ and for Christ alone. Amen
