# THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

# 1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Joshua 3: 7-17

# A READING FROM THE BOOK OF JOSHUA

The Lord said to Joshua, "This day I will begin to exalt you in the sight of all Israel, so that they may know that I will be with you as I was with Moses. You are the one who shall command the priests who bear the ark of the covenant, 'When you come to the edge of the waters of the Jordan, you shall stand still in the Jordan." Joshua then said to the Israelites, "Draw near and hear the words of the Lord your God." Joshua said, "By this you shall know that among you is the living God who without fail will drive out from before you the Canaanites, Hittites, Hivites, Perizzites, Girgashites, Amorites, and Jebusites: the ark of the covenant of the Lord of all the earth is going to pass before you into the Jordan. So now select twelve men from the tribes of Israel, one from each tribe. When the soles of the feet of the priests who bear the ark of the Lord, the Lord of all the earth, rest in the waters of the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan flowing from above shall be cut off; they shall stand in a single heap." When the people set out from their tents to cross over the Jordan, the priests bearing the ark of the covenant were in front of the people. Now the Jordan overflows all its banks throughout the time of harvest. So when those who bore the ark had come to the Jordan, and the feet of the priests bearing the ark were dipped in the edge of the water, the waters flowing from above stood still, rising up in a single heap far off at Adam, the city that is beside Zarethan, while those flowing toward the sea of the Arabah, the Dead Sea, were wholly cut off. Then the people crossed over opposite Jericho. While all Israel were crossing over on dry ground, the priests who bore the ark of the covenant of the Lord stood on dry ground in the middle of the Jordan, until the entire nation finished crossing over the Jordan.

# THE HOLY GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples, "The scribes and the Pharisees sit on Moses' seat; therefore, do whatever they teach you and follow it; but do not do as they do, for they do not practise what they teach. They tie up heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on the shoulders of others; but they themselves are unwilling to lift a finger to move them. They do all their deeds to be seen by others; for they make their phylacteries broad and their fringes long. They love to have the place of honour at banquets and the best seats in the synagogues, and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, and to have people call them rabbi. But you are not to be called rabbi, for you have one teacher, and you are all students. And call no one your father on earth, for you have one Father the one in heaven. Nor are you to be called instructors, for you have one instructor, the Messiah. The greatest among you will be your servant. All who exalt themselves will be humbled, and all who humble themselves will be exalted.

#### Sermon

In 2016, the graduating class of Huron College, some 37 men refused to take up their postings from the Bishop of Huron. They all enlisted in the Canadian Armed Forces. The Bishop was not happy, he refused to release them for service, but to a man they all enlisted. One particular story is often told about that class. It was common in those days for the Padres to carry a communion kit in a small suitcase. It had a bible, a paten and chalice, a cross, and a few linens to set the table. The Rev was ensconced with a platoon as they were marching across a field and as they crested a hill they took some fire from the side. This particular padre was hit, but not his body, the kit. A bullet had pierced the suitcase and the chalice. Years later, the family returned the kit to the college after the fellow had passed away. The kit is used every year at Remembrance Day to celebrate the Eucharist. The chalice still has a hole in it, you can only fill it halfway. I tell you this story because it was in 2013 when I served my first communion at the college using this kit. I never knew the Reverend Walter Brown, but I know his story of service and sacrifice, and now so do you.

The second story is closer to home. Robert Henry Thornton was my maternal grandfather. As a young man, he served in the Canadian Forces, cadets and reserve units. For over 10 years he faithfully served his country. But life went on, he married a beautiful woman and they had two kids when the second world war broke out. He went down to rejoin his old unit but was told he was too old. He went home frustrated and then headed up to Calgary where he lied about his age and became a private once again. He served 6 years in Morpeth England with an American unit, repairing airplanes as they came back from the front. Meanwhile, the military uprooted my grandmother and her two children to Ontario. My grandfather was a man of faith, he knew who he was and what was expected of him. He knew that to serve God is to serve the least of these. The way forward in this life and the next is to walk with Jesus along his path which leads to Jerusalem and Easter. It leads to death, but also to ascension and resurrection. It leads to life beyond death. We know that God is with us when we choose the difficult path, no matter what that might be in our life in this day and age.

So this day we take a moment to remember those who have walked before us in faith. Those who paid with their lives in service to their countries, so that we might live with the freedom we have to choose life. So that we may tell others of the choice we have made to follow Jesus, to know God and to be blessed by the Holy Spirit. As you receive the elements of the eucharist today, the body and blood of Christ, recall the stories you have heard this day and the stories of

others that you know. Remember them. Dedicate their memories to God by taking the time to share them with others.

Lest we forget, Amen.
